- Questions for Your Students: What are some different ways that a composer applies accompaniment with the melody?
- What Students should look for in the Video Resources: Define and experience melody with multiple accompaniments layered upon one another (Ravel), canon while adding harmonies (Bizet), and different melodies layered on top of one another (Bizet).
